





Immediate priorities

- Supporting existing on-ground community led activities and establishment of demonstration sites to deliver integrated, best practice management actions
- Build a network of regional feral pig coordinators to work with local management groups and agencies
- Increase the adoption of integrated, best practice management by land managers
- Develop appropriate performance measures and methodologies to measure outcomes of management programs
- Develop and promote best practice guidelines and templates for local management plans to enable consistent monitoring, measuring and reporting of progress
- Add value by attracting additional investment to support on-ground actions of communityled groups
- Strengthen stakeholder networks through continued expansion of the NFPAP's Information Hub and other communication and engagement activities
