# The National Feral Pig Action Plan 2021-2031 provides the national coordinated framework to bring everyone together to reduce impacts caused by feral pig populations across Australia.

Community engagement, collaboration and coordination are key to achieving long term reductions in feral pig impacts and their populations.

- 3. Increased adoption of best practice methods and systems by land managers

- Aerial shooting
- Trapping
- Ground shooting
- Exclusion fencing

- Having measurable management strategies in place
- Sharing learnings between management groups, supported by our network of demonstration sites
- Overcoming short term program duration and resourcing constraints
- Capturing and using data and information to engage and motivate land managers in local activities
- Applying technology and science-based information effectively to inform management strategies and increase knowledge of outcomes on changes to assets being protected and/or feral pig populations
- Quantifying and communicating benefits being achieved from management actions to all stakeholders, including the general public
- Striving to deliver long term reductions in feral pig impacts
